**We've got a game for that.**

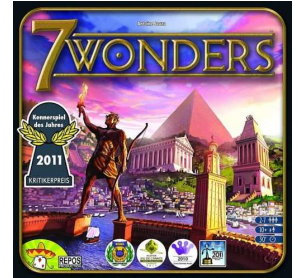

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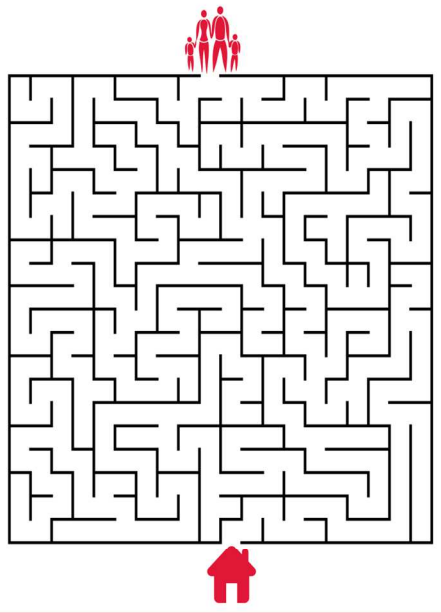

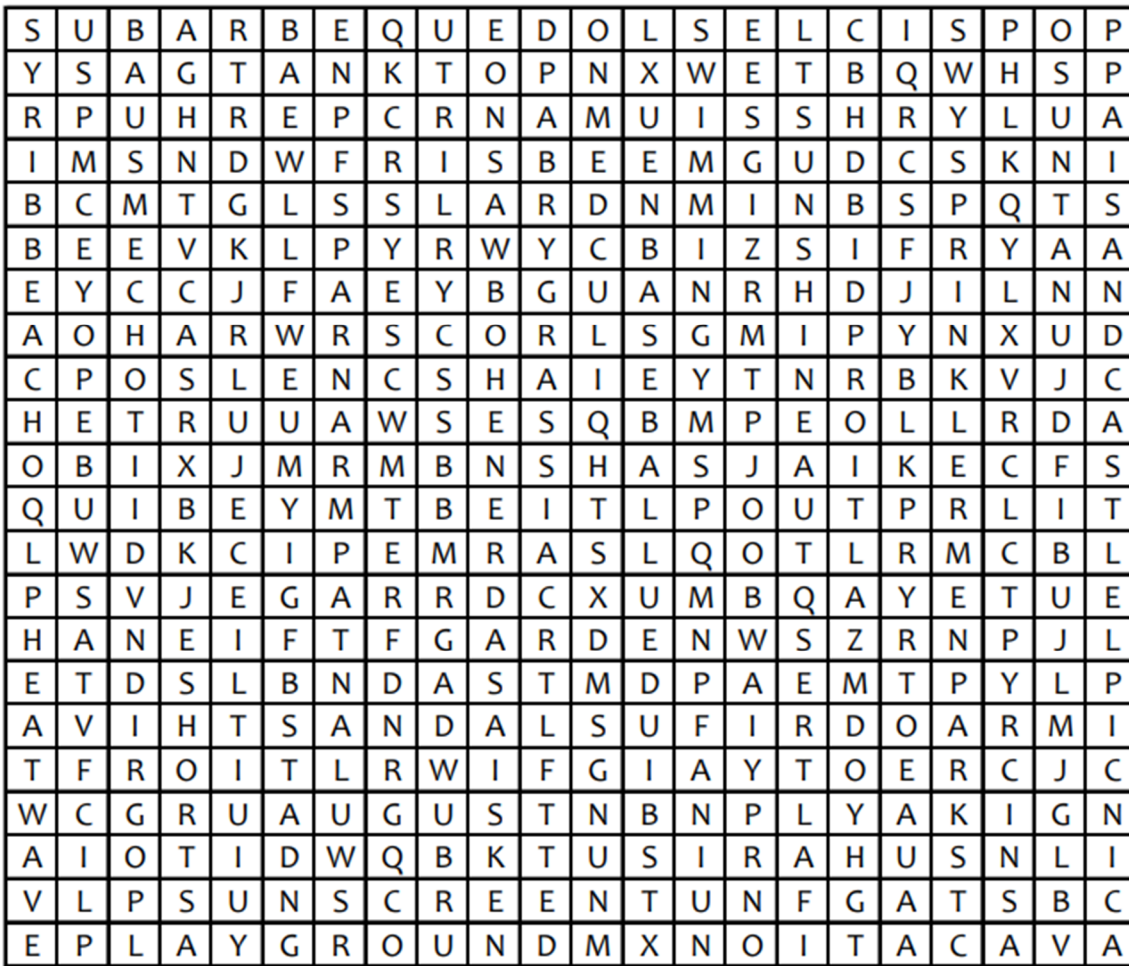

Eleanor Abbott, a schoolteacher in San Diego, was in the hospital recuperating from polio. She saw a need to help keep kids spirits high and pass the time, so she created Candy Land. She purposely made this game very simple so all kids could play, only needing to know colours and simple counting. It was later sold to Milton Bradley in 1949.

**BADENOPOLY Rules**

Object– To obtain as much cash and property in your pre-set time frame.

Tools required– Two dice. Use coins as currency, (see box at left). Select a figurine as your marker and a piece of paper to record your properties.

Method– Designate a player as banker. All players receive \$1500 from the banker. All start at “Proceed”. Roll two dice on your turn. Doubles rolled means an extra turn. If you land on a vacant property, then you can buy it for the price stated and record it on your personal sheet. If someone else owns it, then pay the rent. If owner has a home (four maximum), double the rent for each home (the maximum rent for Mill Street = \$50). Players must own the entire group of properties (eg. Mill and Charles) before purchasing homes. When purchasing homes place the coins on that specific property. Own all four railroads and double the rent. Trades can be made at players discretion.

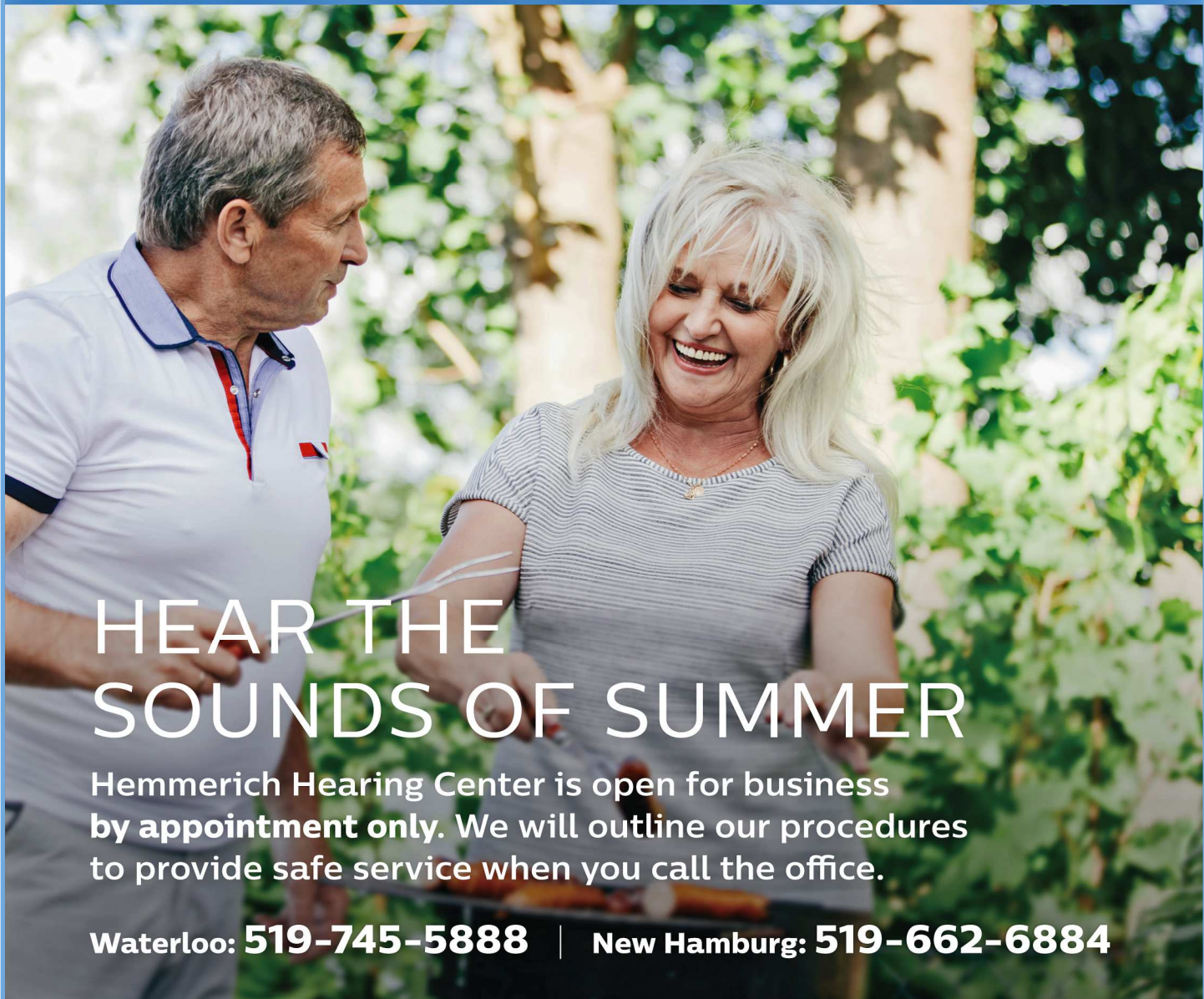

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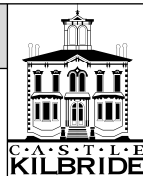
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When you have twelve children, you need to keep them occupied! James and Louisa Livingston of Castle Kilbride ensured that their children expanded their minds and explored their playful sides through an abundance of toys and games. Some of the finest toys in the museum's collection date back to the first generation. One of these fun and exciting games continues to be an entertaining piece and dates to the 1880s. Although it looks elaborate, it has the simple name of "Skittles and Top." By winding string around the top and letting go from one end of the board, the objective is to knock over as many skittle pins and ring as many bells as possible. Each skittle has points connected to it, starting with

one point at the front of the board, while the highest point of nine is at the far end. One never knows where the top will go as it usually spins and bounces around for at least two minutes. When the top has finished spinning, it is time to add up the points.

The next opponent resets the board and takes their chance at winning. We can only imagine the Livingston children cheering each other on and then boasting over who won the game that day.

This game was sold at auction and was returned home to Castle Kilbride in 2001. Today, it is found in the library and is one of the most treasured artifacts at the museum.

Staff cannot resist the pull to play and are always happy to demonstrate the game to visitors. After the tour, guests have a modern version of the skittles game to test their skills on. When the museum safely reopens, you can bet the sound of ringing bells and cheers from players will be reverberating through the Castle.
