## Did you know?? History of Monopoly

1903: Lizzie Magie applies for a patent for The Landlord's Game, which eventually became the inspiration behind *Monopoly*. She created the game to demonstrate the effects of rent on property owners and tenants.

**1904:** The patent for *The Landlord's Game* is granted.

1906: Magie begins publishing the game through the Economic Game Company.

1924: A second patent for The Landlord's Game is granted.

1932: Charles Darrow played The Landlord's Game and decided to make his own version, adapting the rules.

1934: He began marketing and distributing the board game under the title of Monopoly.

1935: Parker Brothers negotiate rights to mass-produce Darrow's version and also purchased Magie's patent for \$500, the equivalent of around \$11,120 in

**1936:** Twenty-thousand *Monopoly* sets are produced each week and it becomes the best-selling board game in the US for the year.

### **Monopoly Fast Facts**

- Hasbro, Monopoly's manufacturer, prints over 30 billion dollars in *Monopoly* money every year.
- Monopoly ranks third in best selling board games of all time, behind checkers in second place, and chess in first.
- The game sells around 3.4 million copies per year on average.
- There are over 2,000 editions of *Monopoly* worldwide with slight variations in each game.
- The Baden Outlook has created their own version, Badenopoly.



Battleship was originally a pad-and-pencil public domain game dating back as early as World War I. By 1931, a patented preprinted paper game was created and was known as Salvo. In 1967, Milton Bradley introduced the game we are familiar with today that includes plastic ships and peg boards. There have been many versions released in the last 50 years including, *Electronic* 

Battleship, Electronic Talking Battleship, Battleship Islands, and many computer and video games too! "You sunk my battleship!"

# Did You Know?? History of Yahtzee

Although dice games have been around for centuries, a wealthy Canadian couple cruising around on their yacht updated and revised a



Tibetan dice game making it more modern. The couple called it, "Yacht Game" or "Yacht at Sea Game" eventually formulating into the name *Yahtzee*. The Canadian couple approached Edwin S. Lowe, a board game maker, and sold their rights to the game in trade for the first 1,000 games produced. They sold and gave

those copies to friends and family who enjoyed playing with them over the years on their yacht.

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### The TCMH Corner: Resident Perspectives

We thought this special Games Edition of the Outlook needed a TCMH Resident feature from someone who likes to have fun and play with things. Enter Brian Smithers, Aldaview Services resident since May 2011. He's a quiet fellow who likes to have coffee with his friends, tell the odd joke, and work with his hands. He might not like boardgames or word searches, but he loves tinkering, being creative, and making models. And he was more than

happy to sit down and tell us about his hobbies.

Brian's first love is for tinkering. He started taking things apart when he was around five or six years old. When Brian isn't indoors making models or taking things apart, he likes to be outside. Especially during summer. His favourite part about summer is the sunshine, however he




does not like getting sun in his eyes. And he really doesn't like to sweat. So, many a sunny summer's day, Brian is found sitting

to mow the lawn with his brother a lot which might have changed Brian's opinion of large grassy areas.


