

And the Winner Is...This spring the NHL will hold a lottery to determine which team picks first, second, and third on the player entry draft. From time to time there is a sure shot franchise player who is available in that



year's draft, and this year it is Connor McDavid of the OHL's Erie Otters. When this article was written, he had only played 38 games this season due to a broken hand, but had amassed 37 goals and 63 assists for 100 points. The NHL has developed a weighted system which is implemented and utilized to determine the order of selection in the first round of the NHL Draft for the 14 Clubs not qualifying for the Stanley Cup Playoffs (or the Clubs that have acquired the first-round drafting positions of those non-playoff teams). The lowest point teams have the best odds of drafting McDavid. They are, as of February 28th, Buffalo 20%, Edmonton 13.5%, Arizona 11.5%, Carolina 9.5 %, and Toronto 8.5%. The other nine teams' odds drop from there. I am sure the Leafs are hoping for some luck on this draft to bring them back to championship form! I can just hear the Hab fans chuckling right now.

Now that's Inflation! – Sticking with sports...I heard on the radio the other day that during the first year of the Toronto Blue Jays in 1977, their payroll was \$878,000. Bill Singer was paid the most at \$100,000, and the team collectively averaged \$32,519 per year. It took until 1984 before they hit the one million dollar mark. The 2015 team salary for the Jays is a whopping \$122,915,900 (eighth in the league), with an average salary of \$5,344,130. **More Records Set** - February will go into the record books as the coldest month on record in 135 years in what's now Waterloo Region; the average temperature was -14.5 C. That beats the previous coldest month in February 1904; the now-defunct Galt weather station registered a -13.3 C average that month. Also, seen below are the latest records for Wilmot populations stats—for your information.

While February is National Pet Dental Health Month, dental health should be a daily ritual for pet owners all year long.

We all enjoy sharing affection with our furry friends, but there's nothing worse than getting a slobbery wet kiss from a dog or a cat with bad breath! Bad breath, also known as halitosis, is generally caused by excessive build-up of odor-producing bacteria inside your pet's mouth, lungs, or even gut. Most cases of bad breath in dogs and cats are due to the build-up of bacteria in the mouth due to poor oral hygiene. In fact, bad breath is the most common warning sign of dental disease. Periodontal disease starts out as plaque. Plaque is a biofilm that contains bacteria which causes gingivitis. Over time, plaque hardens, forming a substance known as tartar. Plaque and tartar lead to swollen, inflamed gums, along with bad breath. The bacteria that builds up in the mouth

can gain access to the blood stream through these inflamed gums. When this happens, the kidneys, heart muscle and liver can be damaged. Pets with severe periodontal disease have more severe microscopic damage in these organs than do pets with less severe periodontal disease.



The best cure for bad breath is to prevent it before it happens. In order to best keep your pet's breath under control, veterinarians recommend that pet owners brush their pet's teeth on a daily basis. Brushing teeth is the best way to cut back on tartar buildup and help control bad breath. Additionally, making sure your pet is on a healthy diet is also important. Your veterinarian can recommend diets that are formulated to help reduce tartar and encourage good oral health - the food actually brushes their teeth while they are chewing! During your pet's annual examination, your pet's teeth will be examined and recommendations can be made to help improve oral health and in turn your pet's overall well-being.







Julie from Baden asks - When did Baden have its first Post Office?



Armand says—Good question Julie! Jacob Beck was Baden's first postmaster in 1857. The first official post office was located at the corner of Snyder's Road and Brewery Street (Central House) and the postmaster was Mr. Boye. The post office moved several times, starting with a frame building at the east corner of Foundry and Snyder's with Fred Holwell as postmaster. After Mr. Holwell's death in 1920 it moved to the west side of Foundry to the drug store, where Mr. H.C. Schumm was postmaster. After his death the post office was relocated to Snyder's Road (the building to the west of the Baden Library). There were several postmasters at that site including Albert Everts, Ella Schmidt, and Betty Uttley. The postal outlet eventually moved to Castleview Variety (now Diggs Music store) and then to its current location at Mars Variety on Snyder's Road East.



If you are a sensitive die-hard Toronto Maple Leaf fan then I suggest you turn the page now. If you have a funny-bone then dive in... and remember these jokes get sent to us!

- ⇒ What do the Leafs and a fine wine have in common? —They both spend a lot of time in the cellar, cost too much, and are only enjoyed on select occasions.

 - —They both look good until they hit the ice.
- ⇒ Why is the Hockey Hall of Fame in Toronto?
 —It's the only way Leafs fans can see the Stanley Cup.
- ⇒ What do the Toronto Maple Leafs and possums have in common?
 - —Both play dead at home and get killed on the road.

One of the quirkiest birds in Waterloo Region during breeding season is the American Woodcock (AMWO). Classified as a shorebird, it is closely related to sandpipers, but it chooses to live in young shrubby deciduous forests and moist, old fields far from a shoreline. Like grouse and pheasant, it is considered a game bird, even though it weighs 25% less than a

Rock Pigeon! Besides these human-imposed oddities, it is also unique physically. Seeing this short-legged, plump-bodied, beady-eyed, long-beaked bird is always a surprise. Some observers jokingly suggest it was assembled from leftover parts.

Oddities aside, it is an incredibly well-adapted bird. The woodcock stalks its prey by walking slowly and listening for movement below the soil surface. Its 6 to 7.5 cm long beak is probed into soft soil, searching for its favourite prey: earthworms. When one is found, the bird ably opens just the very tip of its long beak, grasping the prey and pulling it from the ground without opening the full length of its beak! Its nostrils are placed very near the skull, allowing the bird to make use of the full length of this specially adapted probing beak. The AMWO, aka Bogsucker or Timberdoodle, can eat up to its own body weight in worms a day. It also consumes snails, beetles, crickets, and grasshoppers.

Its large bulging eyes are placed well back and high on its head, giving it the unique ability to see a full 360 degrees. These well-placed eyes allow it to probe for food, yet still have a clear view of its entire surroundings. This unusual eye placement means its ears are found in front of its eyes. Additionally, its



brain is upside down, unique among birds, and is positioned below its eyes.

The Timberdoodle is possibly best known for its spectacular flight display, a song and flight routine designed to attract female attention. In late March, the male AMWO chooses a "singing ground" territory, an open area of young seedlings or an old field with a scattering of small trees. The

male begins his serenade at last light by issuing a series of loud buzzy "peents." He then takes to the air, wing feathers emitting a twittering sound as he ascends in a widening spiral before disappearing in the darkening sky. Once reaching a height of about 300 feet, he begins a zigzag descent while uttering a chirping sound, becoming silent just before landing near his takeoff point. If impressed, a female flies in. After mating she leaves the immediate area and has sole responsibility for rearing young. The male returns to his attention seeking ritual and will do so for the following month.

Meanwhile, the female clears a small depression in leaf litter as her nest. She lays one egg a day and, once completing the normal clutch of four eggs, begins a 21 day incubation period. Adult Timberdoodles are amazingly well camouflaged and only flush from a nest when almost stepped upon. The equally well camouflaged chicks are precocious and leave the nest within hours of hatching. The hen broods her chicks frequently at first but they grow and learn to find their own food quickly. Within one month the young are almost as large as their parents and fly skillfully, and after two months, they are ready to continue in the wingbeats of their uniquely adapted parents.

Improving the Health of our Community

~ Depression Among Teens, Part 1

The statistics are alarming. Depression among teens is on the rise. Twenty-four percent of all deaths among 15-24 years olds are the result of suicide. Suicide is 4x higher for men than women. Five percent of male youth and 12% of female youth will experience a major depressive episode during this period in their lives.

Recognizing depression in teens can be very difficult. We may dismiss some of the symptoms as hormonal, or the "rebellious teenage years." We often hope or expect that our youth will mature out of this phase. However, if we dismiss all of these signs, we may miss some of the early warning signs of depression.

Some of the early warning signs may include (but are not limited to):

- Changes in feelings We may notice that our teens are unhappy, lonely, angry, or worried. They may also be feeling rejected over a relationship loss, struggling academically, or by not getting into a college or university program that they had hoped for.
- Changes in physical health Some of the changes in physical health include feeling tired all of the time or having difficulties eating or sleeping. They could be gaining or losing weight unexpectedly. They could also

be complaining of general aches and pains, including headaches.

- Changes in thinking patterns We may notice that they have difficulty concentrating or completing tasks at school. They may struggle with low self-esteem or self-dislike and talk about themselves using negative terms. They may also show signs of thinking about suicide.
- Changes in behaviour You may notice that they withdraw from others, or cry easily. They may show less interest in sports, games, or other activities that they previously enjoyed.

We often ask the question, "What causes depression in teens?" or "Where did it come from?" There are a number of contributing factors for depression in teens, and it is not an exact science. It is often like trying to solve a puzzle. We look at the pieces that we have, and try to figure it out. If there is a family history of depression or some other mental illness, this may increase the likelihood of depression for some youth. There may also be some life events that contribute to a depressive episode. Major life events may include a change in the family make-up (separation or divorce), loss of a close family member or friend, history of abuse, bullying or other trauma, certain medications, or illness. Another contributing factor may be experimentation or use of any drug including marijuana.

We may often feel overwhelmed trying to help support our children or others we know who struggle with depression. Next month, we will look at some of the ways to help support teens with depression.

HOW TO CHOOSE THE RIGHT MATTRESS

Choosing the right mattress can go a long way to determine the quality of your sleep. Using a mattress that does not provide adequate support and comfort can also be a significant source of muscle and joint pain, especially in the shoulder, back, and hip regions.

The right mattress is usually defined as any mattress that helps a person sleep well, so that they wake up feeling rested and without pain and stiffness. However, there is no single best mattress for everyone as there are a variety of factors that go into choosing the right mattress.

Below are some useful tips that can help you find the mattress that's right for you:

- Consider how your mattress is made. Mattress support is determined by the internal architecture of the mattress. This can include innerspring coil mattresses (most common), memory foam, latex, and air mattresses. Each offer different degrees of support and comfort. Some manufacturers also include additional padding on top of the mattress for extra comfort, but this may not be necessary for all individuals.
- Sleep experts recommend replacing your mattress on average every 8-10 years or sooner. Look for visible sagging and/or material breakdown as a sign to replace your mattress. Over time, mattresses collect dust mites and other germs that can exacerbate allergies and impact sleep. In addition, our bodies change over time and an old mattress that had originally been comfortable may no longer be providing the comfort and support it once did.
- Your physical health and your mattress. Sleeping with painful conditions such as osteoarthritis, hip bursitis, and

degenerative disc disease can be minimized by choosing the right mattress. You can also incorporate additional sleep positioning tips to get the most comfort out of your mattress.

- Try before you buy. Lay on a variety of mattresses (i.e. firm, medium, pillow top) for at least 10-15 minutes in several simulated sleep positions to get a sense of how the mattress
- **Shop at stores that specialize in mattresses.** These stores will offer a diverse range of choices and other important factors such as manufacturer and comfort warranties.
- The right mattress achieves a balance between comfort and support. A mattress that is too firm may cause pain in pressure points such as the hips. A mattress that is too soft may not offer enough support and cause pain and stiffness. Most people do well with a medium-firm mattress. However, at the end of the day, a person's overall comfort level will determine which mattress is right for them.

If you experience muscle and joint pain that is causing difficulty with your sleep, you should contact a licensed health professional who deals in the diagnosis and treatment of these conditions. For more information, visit www.nhwc.ca.

If you do decide to list your home in the winter, here are a few tips that may help you be more successful in a winter sale:


- Turn up the heat! Make your house warm and comfortable even if it is for the short time the house is being viewed.
